

Charlotte Bronte's "Jane Eyre," one of the most widely-read English novels for the past hundred years, comes to Channel Six as a special August treat, beginning Friday, August 5 at 9:00 p.m. and continuing through the month.

The new, four-part dramatization recreates Bronte's poignant 19th century story of an unwanted girl, her spirited fight against adversity, and her search for love and happiness in a harsh, classridden society.

JANE EYRE stars Sorcha Cusack in the title role, and Michael Jayston as Rochester, the man with whom she ultimately finds happiness and fulfillment. Produced by the British Broadcasting

Corporation (BBC) and dramatized by Robin Chapman, the gripping story is just as relevant today as it was when Bronte first wrote it over a century ago.

The daughter of an eccentric Irish clergyman, Charlotte Bronte's first novel, "The Professor," was rejected and did not appear in print until after her death in 1855. "Jane Eyre," which appeared in 1847, immediately made Bronte world-famous. Her other novels are "Shirely," (1849) and "Villette" (1853).
